- 6 2. Brevity is strongly encouraged for the parties' filings; the parties are reminded of the word
7 limit requirements under King County Local Rule 7(b)(5)(B)(vi) and corresponding certifica-
8 tion requirements;
- 9 3. If desired or needed, the parties may file federal pleadings from the removed action for this
10 case in the remanded state court matter under cover of the state court action caption. If the
11 parties merely want to bring such pleadings to the Court's attention, the parties may provide
12 the Court with a link to a shared drive containing the records;
- 13 4. King County is to prepare a dismissal of Amy Behope for the Court's entry as part of the state
14 court records for consistency with the other dismissals entered by the Court;
- 15 5. The Court sets argument on the Renewed Motion to Intervene filed by the Washington State
16 Democratic Central Committee for May 12, 2023 at 1:30 p.m. with oral argument;
